Olaf T. Engvig is a maritime historian, photographer, author of numerous books, and consultant to maritime museums in Norway, Sweden, the U.K. and U.S. He's an international expert on the history of shipbuilding, including the use of iron and steel. His main passion is the restoration and preservation of historic ships, and he's been instrumental in restoring many unique old vessels. Engvig constantly seeks to keep maritime history alive for future generations to appreciate.

Olaf Engvig's roots are in Rissa, Norway, where Johan Bojer wrote his book "The Last of the Vikings" (Den Siste Viking). Engvig learned to square sail from Jakob Kvithyll, the skipper Bojer described in his book.

He has been the editor of several magazines in Norway, and a leader of marine archaeological expeditions and excavations. In addition, he was the founder and CEO of a ship wharf specializing in restoration of historic ships.
